Introduction

Run by the Postgraduate Diploma in Asian Art at SOAS University of London, our Specialist Art Short Courses are open to all and aimed at individuals from a wide variety of backgrounds seeking to broaden their knowledge of specialised areas of Asian art.

Short courses are ideal for those who do not have the opportunity to attend <u>our full-time programme</u>. They also serve as a taster for our longer, more immersive modules while enabling us to specialise in specific areas which are not covered in depth within the Postgraduate Diploma modules.

Our short courses run in two distinct formats: in-person and online.

In-person specialist art courses explore a single topic over an intensive four-day programme, including lectures by leading experts. Where appropriate we also include practising artists, musicians and museum and gallery visits and object-study sessions.

Online specialist art courses offer eight weekly lectures by leading experts from academia, museums and the art market. Lectures are followed by in-depth discussions moderated by the course convenor.

In 2022-2023 we are thrilled to offer a combination of weekly, online short courses as well as four-day, in-person courses, including:

The registration fee for an in-person short course is £625 and the registration fee for an online short course is £375. More information on each course follows.

Scholarships

These scholarships cover the full registration fee* and are intended for those in early in the early stages of their academic or professional development as well as mature and life-long learners.

The application form requires a short statement illustrating how this course will benefit you professionally, academically and / or personally as well as a brief statement of financial need.

Applications will be reviewed by the Programme Manager and Programme Director and will be judged on the basis of both impact and financial need.

*Please note that scholarships cover registration fees only. For in-person short courses, the associated costs of being present in London for four days, including travel to and from lectures and visits, will have to be covered by yourself.

This in-person course coincides with a major British Museum exhibition and is convened by Dr Sara Peterson, with Prof Lloyd Llewellyn-Jones.


This course explores the luxurious world of the ancient Persians, looking at life in the great palaces of Persepolis and Susa and examining how Persian imperial taste pervaded every corner of its vast empire.

<u>Devī: Gender & South Asia's Fierce Goddesses</u> <u>Dazzling, Demonic, Divine</u>

19 May – 7 July 2023



This **online** course is convened by Ms Sandra Sattler co-convenor of the Arts of India and Arts of the Buddhist World modules of the Postgraduate Diploma.

This course gives you a kaleidoscopic overview of wrathful goddesses, introducing their diverse histories, forms, and meanings. You will encounter the Goddess in multiple ways and follow her rise in the Hindu tradition, ranging from the warrior Durgā to the skeletal Cāmuṇḍā, from the shapeshifting yoginīs to the dark goddess Kālī, and expanding beyond the Hindu pantheon to include the tantric female Buddhas who share many qualities with their Hindu contemporaries. As ferocious goddesses were frequently seen through a patriarchal gaze, this course offers you a detailed exploration of gender and female agency in premodern and contemporary India.
